- Introduction to Anti-Racist Clinical Care

### Workshop Description

- This This 6-hour training (*divided into 1 hour weekly or 2-hour weekly sessions*) increases participants' knowledge of the impact of medical mistrust, intersectionality, and implicit bias on provider-patient interactions. This training provides participants with strategies, skills, and tools to improve their patient interactions and avoid racist language and behaviors. This training's primary goal is to inform culturally responsive, high-quality care for patients with HIV and increase engagement of patients from diverse backgrounds. The course audience is clinical prescribers- CME/CNE is available.

### Workshop Objectives

Participants who complete the training will be able to:

- Describe the history of medical mistrust in the context of HIV research, treatment, and care in the US.
- Define and describe structural intersectionality as it applies to HIV medical treatment and clinical outcomes.
- Define and discuss examples of implicit bias and the impact on health outcomes for historically oppressed populations.
- Review tools and implementation strategies to provide equitable HIV clinical services.
